Billy Graham Library Charlotte, NC: Journey through history with one of the most influential voices of the 20th century. Learn more about Billy Graham and his message of God's love. Walton's Mountain Museum Schuyler, WV: Experience involves visiting Walton's Mountain Museum in Schuyler, Virginia, a former elementary school that has been transformed into a museum dedicated to the TV show The Waltons. Visitors can expect to see rooms recreated to look like those from the show, such as John Boy's bedroom and Ike's store, along with various memorabilia, photos, and personal items from author Earl Hamner Jr.'s life. The Andy Griffith Museum Mt. Airy, NC: Provides a permanent place for the world's largest collection of Andy Griffith memorabilia. Located next to the Andy Griffith Playhouse and a half-mile from Andy's boyhood home, the museum houses items collected by child-hood friend Emmett Forrest. The museum includes iconic signs from the show's courthouse doors that read: "Sheriff" and "Justice of the Peace." There are also mementos from Don Knotts who played Deputy Barney Fife, actress Betty Lynn who played Thelma Lou and George Lindsey who played Goober. **Destination Stop**

Lancaster Central Market: Located in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, is America's oldest continuously operated farmers market building, established in 1730. It operates year-round, offering local foods, Pennsylvania Dutch specialties, produce, baked goods, meats, cheeses, and crafts. The market is housed in a historic red brick building and is a popular spot for regional food, souvenirs, and local character.

President James Buchanan's Wheatland: Come discover the warmth and hospitality of President James Buchanan's Wheatland. Costumed tour guides share facts and stories from Buchanan's personal and professional life. Buchanan represented Pennsylvania in the United States House of Representatives and later the Senate, served as Minister to Russia, Secretary of State, and Ambassador to the United Kingdom. And, in 1856, Wheatland served as the hub of his successful campaign to become the 15th President of the United States. During his presidency, Wheatland served as Buchanan's retreat as a divided nation struggled with slavery and states' rights. Post-presidency, Wheatland became Buchanan's refuge as he avoided public life after his term and retired as a private citizen. Wheatland's tangible connection to the US Presidency, Antebellum and Civil War America, and the American political process make it instrumental to teaching history to modern day visitors.

Strasburg Railroad: Steam through scenic Lancaster County aboard America's oldest operating railroad, where the first thing you can expect is an authentic steam railroad experience! Strasburg Railroad steam locomotives, beautifully restored and carefully maintained by a world-class staff. Our regular steam train excursion provides a 45-minute roundtrip through the countryside, while an audio commentary highlights the history of the railroad and surrounding area. More than 2,500 acres of farmland are visible from the train, much of which is farmed by our Amish neighbors.

Longwood Gardens: In 1906, industrialist Pierre du Pont (1870-1954) purchased a small farm near Kennett Square, PA, to save a collection of historic trees from being sold for lumber. Today is one of the world's great horticultural displays, encompassing 1,077 acres of dazzling gardens, woodlands, meadows, fountains, 10,010-pipe Aeolian organ and 4.5-acre conservatory. Longwood continues the mission set forth by Mr. du Pont to inspire people through excellence in garden design, horticulture, and education.

The Amish Village: The Amish Village is an authentic look at today's Amish lifestyle. Located on 12 scenic acres, The Amish Village lets visitors experience an authentic Amish property, including a one-room schoolhouse, blacksmith shop, smokehouse market and more. To begin an understanding of the Pennsylvania Dutch culture, The Amish Village provides a 25-minute guided farmhouse tour. A 90-minute back roads bus tour is also offered to take you off the beaten path, past working farms and along country roads where buggies roll along and farmers work their fields.

Gettysburg National Military Park Museum & Visitor Center: The Battle of Gettysburg, a turning point in the Civil War, was the Union victory that ended General Robert E. Lee's second and most ambitious invasion of the North. Often referred to as the "High Water Mark of the Rebellion," Gettysburg was the Civil War's bloodiest battle and was also the inspiration for President Abraham Lincoln's immortal "Gettysburg Address. A New Birth of Freedom," narrated by Morgan Freeman, orients you to the battle; then see the sights and hear the battle in the historic Cyclorama Painting Experience. Finally, tour the museum, packed with original artifacts and interactive exhibits.

The Hershey Story Museum: Hershey starts here! How did Milton Hershey go from bankruptcy to brilliance, transforming chocolate from a luxury to an everyday treat? How did he invent a community? Why did he give away his fortune? That's the Hershey story. Enjoy a 45-minute, hands on class in the Chocolate Lab and sample warm drinking chocolate from around the world at Tastings. Grab a delicious treat from the Pantry Café and find a unique assortment of keepsakes and chocolate at Museum Shop.

Mennonite Information Center: A place to come to learn about the Mennonites and The Amish of Lancaster County through literature, videos, guided tours, and conversation with a knowledgeable staff person. Also, we have a full-scale model of the Biblical Tabernacle on our grounds.

Kitchen Kettle Village: Showcases all that Lancaster County has to offer — homemade baked goods, jams and relishes, good food with unexpected touches and charming one-of-a-kind overnight lodging in a picturesque countryside. We're also famous for our unique shopping experience, featuring 40 distinct merchants offering everything from locally made art, pottery and PA Dutch quilts.
